

Surprise, Surprise! 2019 was New Zealand's fourth warmest year since 1909

2019, clocked in as New Zealand's fourth warmest since 1909 with an average temperature of 13.37°C. NIWA's annual climate summary shows it's now been 35 months since New Zealand had a month with below average temperatures. Five of the past seven years have been among New Zealand's hottest on record. The hottest year on record for New Zealand was 2016 with a nationwide average temperature of 13.45°C. The years 1998 and 2018 are tied in second place with an average of 13.41°C.

Trapped Personnel Alarm Kit

The trapped personnel alarm kit is a safety system for low temperature cold rooms. The person trapped inside the cold room can press the emergency button to ask for help, and a siren ensures audible and visible signal outside, where the permanent presence of a person is guaranteed.

The kit includes:

- Control unit to be fixed outside the cold room (with n.o. alarm relay), provided with siren to alert about alarm.
- Backup battery housed inside the control unit, supplies power in the event of blackouts (12Vdc,10h life time).
- Emergency button to be installed inside the cold room. The LEDs that light up the emergency button are permanently on.

Another good kiwifruit season is likely

Although it's early days yet, there are promising signs of it being another good year for kiwifruit. Zespri's chief grower and alliances officer, Dave Courtney told Rural News that the feedback from growers on the state of the vines is very positive. He says towards the end of last year, flower numbers and pollination was looking good. He's heard nothing that would suggest there were any problems.

This news comes on the back of a good season for Zespri, which for the first time saw more gold kiwifruit sold in the market than the traditional green variety. Courtney says that the higher price paid in the market for gold meant that grower returns were better than in past years. And with more gold being planted, all being well, returns to growers will continue to increase.



"Last season saw volumes slightly down on the previous season and the size of fruit was also smaller. But the quality was better and the season started earlier which allowed us to put strong volumes into the marketplace and that continued throughout the year.







EastPack uses new technology to increase storage capacity

EastPack has installed a second fully automated coolstore (20 m high). The new building will hold a million trays. Eastpack CEO Hamish Simson says the reasons for the new coolstore are twofold. "We are increasingly looking at automation to achieve a few outcomes," he says.

"We are getting to the point where we have less and less usable land on our sites, so we can't go out anymore, we've got to go up." "For storage options requiring forklifts, the height limit is the equivalent of three storeys, meaning that automation is needed for anything higher.

Technology's always changing.
[The new stores] use a hybrid of a couple of technologies, what we call large robotic cranes which run down an aisle and carry a pallet and put it in a slot. For very deep racking, the shuttle then picks up the pallet and takes it deep into the racking."
